BROAD BAY SCHOOL

This term we have really enjoyed getting our Garden to Table program underway. This program sees children enthusiastically getting their hands dirty and learning how to grow, harvest, prepare and share fresh, seasonal food. The Otago Community Trust has granted us \$3000 to spend on gardening and kitchen equipment, for which we are very grateful. The children have so far planted spinach, garlic, broad beans, peas, and redcurrants, and are excited about seeing their edible crops grow! As I write this, the students and teachers are busy preparing soup and bread to share with their families at our Pukaka Matariki Hakari. Māori traditionally celebrated this time of year by coming together and sharing knowledge. This gathering is an opportunity to share with our school community our new charter and website (see them both at broadbay.school.nz), as well as sharing kai and enjoying each other's company.

Our annual Book Rummage will be held on Thursday 29th October. We are ready to accept book donations now, so please think of us if you are having a clear out! Many thanks to the wonderful Friends of Broad Bay School for the huge amount of work they put in to organising the Book Rummage - our main fundraising event - every year.

From the beginning of next term, we resume **Kōrero Cafe**, our community initiative, on Tuesday mornings, 9:00-10:30am in Room 4. STOP- Most of the planting area has been prepared for this season's planting of approximately 1,500 trees and shrubs and the plants ordered. The preparation would not have been possible without our full time employee, Duncan Ross. The releasing for previous years has now also been finally completed. We have now had two groups out to do planting, (Horticulture students and Conservation Volunteers) as well as the regular twice-weekly working bees. John Aldis, Alf Webb and Duncan have also spent time dealing to patches of banana passionfruit that could potentially threaten the planting. OTAGO PENINSULA BIODIVERSITY GROUP

Now we have entered Level 1, OPBG is resuming possum control on the Otago Peninsula. Contractors began prefeeding bait stations in the northern areas of the peninsula in early June and putting toxin in them by early July. OPBG staff were busy during lockdown filming videos on the backyard deployment of possum traps and updating a Fact Pack containing information about OPBG activities over the 2020-2021 period. This new information is available through the Resources tab on the OPBG website. A big thank you to the backyard trappers who caught a majority of the 57 possums caught in Lockdown over April. The possums have ceased roaming around looking for mates and are hunkering down for winter and to bear their young. Over May-July possums are known to eat Tutu, Mahoe/Whiteywood, Kanuka, Macrocarpa and Pine, grasses, clover and invertebrates. Food is scarce over the next few months, making it a great time to detect and trap possums. If you want to place chew-cards to detect possums, or a trap to catch one please contact us through the OPBG website (predatorfreepeninsula.nz). Now that possum numbers have been reduced to low levels in some regions of the peninsula, each possum caught or sighted really counts, so we encourage you to keep reporting possums at possums@opbg.nz.

OTAGO PENINSULA COMMUNITY BOARD NEWS: Work on the Peninsula Connection now continues after the Broad Bay to Company Bay section was held up during lockdown. One-lane traffic controlled by traffic lights is the norm during weekdays. The completion date for this section is now June / July 2021. The Turnbull's Bay wall stabilisation was completed in March. There are still Traffic lights between Glenfalloch and Vauxhall; however, this section should be completed by the end of this month.

New slip on Highcliff Road: A slip has developed on Highcliff Road between Seal Point Road and the recent 'two-car slip'. It is being assessed by the DCC and is currently controlled by traffic lights.

Post-Covid Forum: As we recover from the disruption of the pandemic, we have an opportunity to assess new possibilities for life on the Otago Peninsula including tourism, small businesses, artists, rūnaka, biodiversity, and others that call this area home.
