All classes visited the Green Island Landfill Station as part of our environmental study and we also have a planned trip to the Recycle Station down by the wharf area. We have had Mark from Hockey Otago visiting and teaching the children hockey skills and also a chap teaching rugby skills. Our netball team is doing well and the new girls are learning fast and loving playing. Thanks to Margaret and Amy for your help with coaching and during games.

The senior children took part in the recent 40 Hour Famine - it's amazing how much they raised. We also had a Wacky Hair Day at school to fundraise for Autism NZ and we raised \$32.

Our quiz night at the Community Centre was a huge success and we raised just over \$900. Thanks to all those from the community who attended to support our school. We plan to spend the money on sports equipment and tape/CD players for each classroom.

We had a small opening ceremony for the pottery kiln that had been donated by the Garey family. Thanks to all who attended.

The basketball hoops are now back in place. We have been assured the new attachments will withstand the rigours of the environment and that it is very unlikely that the failure of the base plate will occur again.

When passing the school you can't help but notice our new gates at the main entrance. Every 5 years the Government gives money to schools for Capital Works projects and these gates come under this. In the past we have used this money for a back gate and new fencing, resealing the tennis court, and resealing and upgrading around the back of the school.

STOP Working Bees

Working bees take place on the last Sunday of the month. The next working bee is at the Big Pyramid 29th June. From 10am on site (allow 15 -20 mins walk from the car park in Dick Road) to 12 noon. Tools to bring - gloves,

loppers, handsaws and Vigilant gel if you have it. Jobs to do are cutting small elders (not the large trunks), putting wire protectors on some plants to stop rabbit and hare damage, and some releasing. Contact person: Moira Parker email moiraparker@clear.net.nz or ph 478 0214.

Wire is needed for making the pegs to anchor down plant cages to protect against rabbits, hares and possums. If you have even a small piece of No 8 or No 10 fencing wire that is surplus to requirements, STOP would appreciate it. Contact Alf Webb 478 0900.
