#### In Memoriam

It is with great sadness that we acknowledge the passing of Broad Bay resident and writer, **Dianne Ruth Pettis**, on 13 May 2008.

Dianne was a talented and successful writer and poet, whose work was published in many literary magazines and journals and broadcast on National Radio.

Her first novel "Like Small Bones" was short-listed for the Commonwealth Writers' Prize best first book. Her second novel "The First Touch of Light" is due for publication by Penguin early next year.

Dianne was the Robert Burns Fellow at the University of Otago in 2006.

Dianne had a great love of poetry, and for some years, conducted regular poetry writing and appreciation workshops with the children at the local schools. These culminated in the publication of the children's work in two books – "Come over here, fat boy" (poems by Broad Bay school pupils published 1998) and "Peninsula Poems" (published by the three Peninsula Schools in 2006.)

In a small community like Broad Bay, lives - and especially the lives of our young people - are enhanced by such commitment. We are grateful for the time and energy Dianne unhesitatingly gave to this project, until ill health made it too difficult for her to continue.

Our condolences go to Dianne's husband, Pete, and her children, Chloe, Tess, Gabe and Rose.

#### **STOP News**

It was heartening to have such a great response to Bruce McKinlay of the Department of Conservation's talk "Reviewing the current state of Mammals, Birds and Reptiles on the Otago Peninsula and identifying any trends".

His observations on the complexity of predator control was particularly thought-provoking – reduce the numbers of one pest and it may allow the rise of another. STOP will be further exploring the possibility of wide area pest control. Bruce suggested that starting with possums could be a way of getting many groups involved.

#### Jewelled gecko poaching

The secretive, but stunning jewelled gecko which is hanging on in small vegetation remnants on the Peninsula fetches high prices from overseas collectors. This has led to a rise in people posing as tourists stealing these members of our community. We were fortunate to have a person from the Wildlife Enforcement Group who agreed at short notice to also give a presentation following the AGM. It was a fascinating insight into how smuggling of endangered species is carried out and where the main threats are coming from. Essentially let the warning bells ring if someone whom you do not know well and can trust, asks you where jewelled geckos can be found, or if you see someone acting suspiciously around areas where geckos may be found. Do not approach them, as they need to be caught with the animals, but merely take their car number plate and note time and date and notify the DOC Compliance Officer, Colin Hitchcock of the Wildlife Enforcement Group (Ph (09) 359 6607, Mobile 029 272 6043), or Rosmarie Müller who is doing research on these animals (Ph 027 230 7005).

#### **Otago Peninsula Community Board**

Welcome to recent newcomers to our community- the Keegan, Hanson and Melville families in Oxley Cres, Waikana St and Holm Ave. It's great to have you in our community!

Members of your Community Board attended Civil Defence training recently. In Broad Bay our Civil Defence Post is at Broad Bay School. Civil Defence's messages are "Get ready, Get thru" and "You may be on your own for 3 days". To be prepared, a database of Broad Bay resources would be useful should we ever find ourselves left to our own devices in Broad Bay for a couple of days, before help reaches us. What skills do we have in Broad Bay? What skills do you have? For example - medical: doctors, nurses, paramedics or people with first-aid skills; engineering, building skills. What about equipment? Do you have a four wheel drive - the kind that could travel over rugged terrain, a digger, do you have a generator - any other equipment that might be useful in a civil defence emergency.? Let me know by phone call or a quick email - your name, your skill/s and your contact details - landline, cell phone and physical address would be great in case all the phone lines are down when we need you!

Have you noticed the great job that the DCC have done recently cutting vegetation back around the Bay? Thanks to the Roading Department of the DCC for their assistance with this, and to those who alerted me to issues - the feedback has been helpful in improving the system. Consideration is being given to removing the flax bushes from the harbourside of the road within Broad Bay to make the shoulder of the road safer for pedestrians.

Your Community Board has made a submission to the DCC's Annual Plan regarding funding for the Portobello Jetty project, public toilet issues, improved directional signage for the Peninsula, Freedom Camping and ongoing water and waste issues to be addressed.
